It IS about accessories - all kinds - and beautifully photographed and presented. No accessory is overlooked including the button, which the authors refer to as "the unsung accessory". This brilliant level of detail is sustained throughout the entire book. The arrangement of the contents is sheer creativity - it's by body zone! Zone 1, the feet and legs; Zone 2, the mid-body; Zone 3, the hand and wrist; Zone 4 the head and neck. Interwoven with the zone concept are practical discussions of color, size, cost, faux vs genuine, and basics vs edgy. And last but not least, wonderful fashion quotes from famous people are lavishly and appropriately sprinkled across the pages. This book is not a recent issue, therefore, some of the accessories may

seem a bit outdated in the year 2009. However, since most of the accessories are "classics", the information can hold-up,--- even today. The photos are colorful and large, and almost every accessory is photographed. The information given in the index (eg: on where to buy some of the items) is probably outdated by now, although some of the stores may still be around. I would not buy this book solely for the index, since the more recent clothing stores can be found on the internet more readily. However, I would buy this book as a reference guide as to what some accessories look like. There are many photos throughout each chapter that show (pictorially) how to use the accessories in various instances. As stated before, the photos are nicely done. This book is not very long (I went through it in an hour or so). CHIC SIMPLE has issued many books in the same format as this book, and therefore, if you are familiar with the CHIC SIMPLE books, you will not be dissatisfied in this book called ACCESSORIES.
