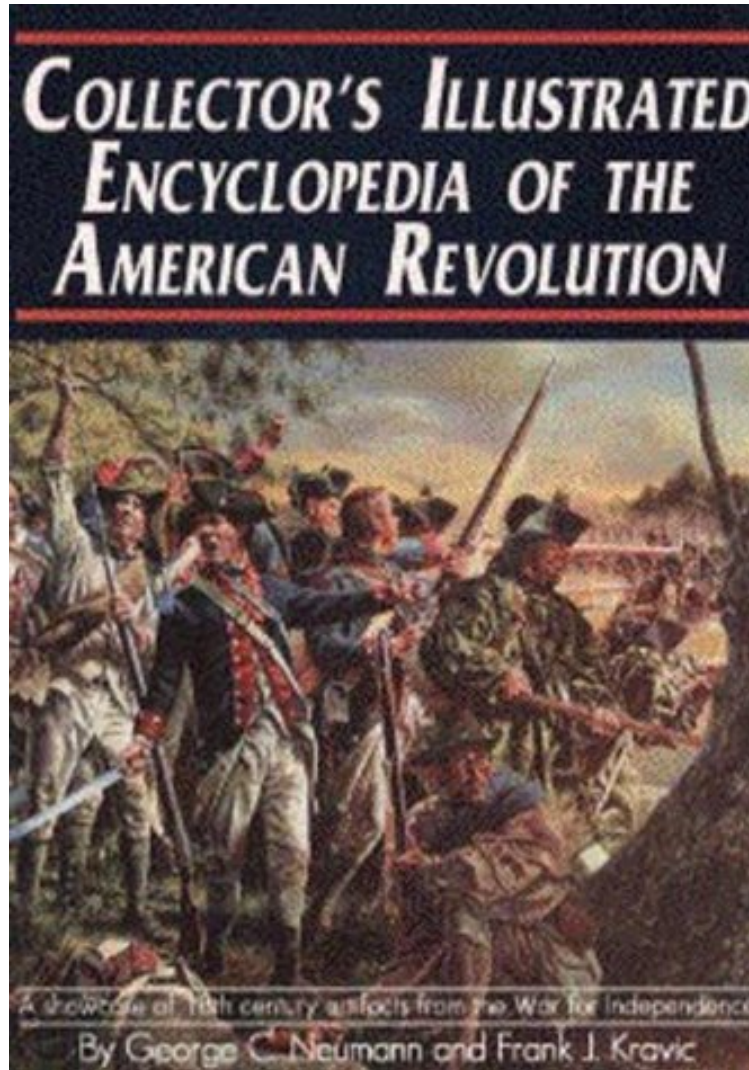

By CustomerAs the title states this is an encyclopedia, all entries are in alphabetical order with cross references and "see also" suggestions. The only real issues are in the page count and internal formatting. The page count limited the number of items that could be included in a single volume thus, like many works of this type, certain items were focused on to the detriment of others. Guns, clothing, personal items and cartridge boxes take up pages and pages of room, yet powder horns and rifle

pouches make up a total of five pages (collectively) and knives are left to flounder with a total of five pages as well. Most items are well photographed, but only from certain angles. Are you interested in the eye shape of axes from this period? Well, you won't see those. Interested in the internals of shot/shooting pouches? Again, out of luck, all you get are single front shots of bags. The formatting can be a touch confusing, the text is laid out as if it is a footnote with text relating to a photo often on a different page. Photos are numbered, but the text simply runs and must be scanned through to find the appropriate text related to that number. The text is scant and often lacks important details. I've heard/read this book pushed as a primary source multiple times and while it is a good source to add to an 18th century research library, it is by no means a reliable primary source. Expanding this "encyclopedia" into multiple volumes would greatly enhance its usefulness, as would increasing the page count, shooting photos from more angles and highlighting the item numbers in the text for faster reference. 2 of 2 people found the following review helpful. That said, it is a great collection of all kinds of relics from the time of the American Revolution. It is a great reference book, and it often gives you a quick reference-identifier of a "what is this thing." I bought it because I bought something on eBay and the seller had referenced it in this book. Leafing through this book, I also found all kinds of other interesting things, too. Use this book and images for a start, and it will tend to guide you as to where to look next if you want to continue your research.
