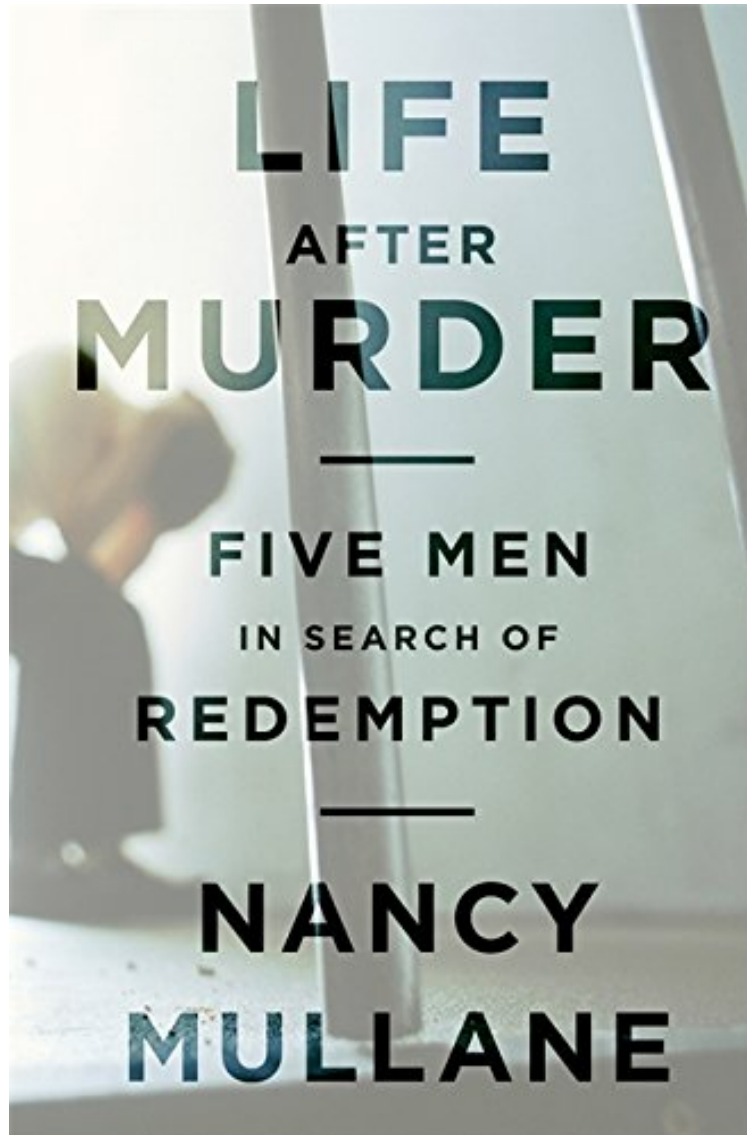

Nancy Mullane has done an incredible job of providing a close-up and personal account of five individuals incarcerated for murder, and the commitment each of them made to changing his thoughts, actions and beliefs in order to become "acceptable" for parole. Unlike most who choose to turn away from such individuals and difficult subjects, Nancy chose to learn first hand from individuals sentenced to life with the possibility of parole, how the process works, and the impact it has on them, their families and loved ones.
